Richard, what can you tell us about your work?

My work is rooted in the two great passions of my aesthetic life—- design and period furnishings and the Italian Arte Povera movement of the 1960s—-admittedly two very disparate sources.

In the first, I am very taken with the great ancient villas and chateaux where they have been blessed with stunning and extravagant interiors, lux fabrics and the smart mixing of periods.

In the second, being a collector many years ago of Arte Povera work from the likes of Fontana, Manzoni, Kounellis, Penone, Merz and the like, I have been thoroughly inculcated with its aura.

Although my own work is painstakingly fabricated, it actually is initially conceived very quickly and fleetingly-mere random visions pulled from my somewhat photographic memory of not only actual pieces of the 60s but snippets of the psychology that gave rise to them.

All of it utilizes classic upholstery methods as the medium and each piece aspires to be somewhat otherworldly and off putting.
